The Centers for Disease Control and our local health authorities are all recommending Flu Shots and the new updated booster Bivalent Vaccine for Covid. These Vaccines are all readily available from the City of Chicago, Hospitals and Medical Clinics.

On Sunday, October 23rd , these Vaccines will also be available from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm in our Parish Hall. There is a Flyer in the Parish Bulletin about getting the Vaccine and you can also pre-register for it. As always, ask your Doctor (s) if they would like you get the vaccines.

I did get the Flu Vaccine this past week and I am planning to get the new updated Covid Vaccine this coming week. I am told you can get both Vaccines on the same day. I could not get the new updated Bivalent Covid Vaccine where I received my Flu Shot because they were not offering it.

look upon all those who do not know Jesus, the Son sent by the Father. May his light draw them and make them receptive to the gift of Faith.


You, who are one with Christ In suffering and in glory, Be mindful of those assailed by trials, That they may discover His liberating Passover, and live by it in hope.

Twenty Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time-C

Lk 18:1-8

Dear Friends,

There are a couple of points we need to make right away. The parable of the judge and widow does not teach us that we can eventually win God over to our side by our strong-minded resolve. The real lesson for us in the story is this: not to lose hope despite, all the hardships and injustices that confront us daily. The parable is inviting us to a persistence that is rooted in loving trust in the goodness of God. We need not worry about God's perseverance. It is our faithfulness that is the issue.

One of the delightful aspects of the story is missing in English where it says that the judge finally gives way to the widow because he fears she may strike him. In the original language, it says he fears that she will give him a black eye.

The main point of the parable is contrasting the self-absorbed and crooked judge with a loving and merciful God. If the poor widow received her due from the corrupt minister of the law, how much more will be the loving response of the God of mercy, compassion, and limitless love. We are called to place trust in our prayer to a God of all goodness. Luke's message is one of exhortation to the disciples and us: be constant in your prayer no matter what.

We can easily see ourselves in the widow, a woman forsaken by society and locked into poverty that seemed ruthless in its destructive power. We may not be caught in the urgency of her immediate economic survival, but poverty attacks us in many ways. Our human condition is always caught in a sense of futility and mortality. We are caught in the consequences of the neglect of our environment. The on-coming horrors of climate change seem totally overwhelming. The issue of sexual harassment in the Church, society and, more often than we might imagine, in the family, often renders us longing for the liberation of a new day. The continual struggle of a fair and compassionate acceptance of sexual orientation begs for a sign of hope from the Church and society. Then there is the engulfing conflict in government where we see the politicians further and further removed from the common good by the parallelizing partisanship that is devoid of compromise. It locks everyone into a senseless stagnation. These are just a few examples how we all share some of the widow's' desperation whether we are aware of it or not.

The widow shows us that for the person of faith and trust, prayer is not the last resort. It is the first resort and always joined to our effort to make a difference. Prayer exposes a sense of God's loving allegiance to all. In the end, God will have the last word. That word is uttered in the victory of Jesus over evil and death In the Pascal Mystery of his death and resurrection.

Like the widow, we are urged to both pray and act for the justice of God. When we are faithful in our commitment to prayer and action, the Son of Man will truly find faith on earth when he comes again. (Lk 18:8)

### **GUIDELINES FOR BREAST CANCER SCREENING**

**Before** your appointment for screening come prepared to answer questions about your **history** and your **family history**. For instance, history of breast cancer, ovarian cancer, pancreatic cancer and any history of a genetic risk if known. Partner with your HCP (health care provider) for recommendations regarding annual screening, CBE (clinical breast exam) and how often you should have one, genetic counseling, if after a **risk assessment** is completed, you fall into the 20 % or higher risk category of developing breast cancer during your lifetime.

**Risk** assessment is done by taking a history and with models that are available to assess this such as the **Gail Model**.

Early detection is the goal of screening for breast cancer because if found early, treatments can be more successful.

Annual 3D mammography or (tomosynthesis) is the standard of care for women over 40 and takes about 20 minutes to perform. For women 39 years of age or younger the care should be based on individual risk history and the appropriate screening based on clinical guidelines for the age group.

Screening is recommended for the asymptomatic individual. If symptoms or signs are present such as painful swelling, skin dimpling or thickening, skin changes or unusual rash in the nipple area or drainage, a nodule, a swollen gland in the armpit area, gynecomastia of the male breast, all are reasons to have a clinical breast exam, diagnostic mammogram and additional imaging such as ultrasound, or

MRI of the breast may be recommended. Findings can lead to the need for a biopsy. Similarly, if a screening mammogram is inconclusive or suspicious, additional studies and a possible biopsy may be needed.

**The guidelines** for screening are designed to diagnose cancer that arises in the milk ducts or milk glands of the breast tissue in individuals who were assigned a female gender at birth. All other scenarios should be discussed with an HCP or breast specialist.




