

# Reflections on the Sunday Readings - Fr. Tracy

Thirty Second Sunday of Ordinary Time-C Lk 20:27-38

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel story the Sadducees challenge Jesus with a simplistic and absurd story about seven brothers marrying the same woman. Jesus turns the story into a profound truth that we profess in the Apostles' Creed: the resurrection of the body. But before we enter the new life where, in the coming age, we neither marry nor are given in marriage, we must face death.


We are in the final weeks of the Church year. The liturgy weaves a very fascinating story of the end and the beginning. In the process it invites us into the mystery of time.

Today we are confronted with the reality our corporal death. Next week we are challenged with the end of the total historical venture that we call the end times. Then the first three weeks of the new year give us the Advent message. It expresses a longing for the new reality that leads us to cry out, "**Come**, **Lord Jesus**"!

In between the message of the ending and the entreaty for the new beginning we celebrate Christ the King. This is a bridge that connects the transiency of our human condition, **our mortality**, with our ultimate purpose and goal in life: to be in the eternal embrace of our loving Lord, **our immortality**.

These are fascinating times. We are ending one year and beginning a new year. We are on the path of salvation with Jesus our Crucified and Risen Savior. We are asked to ponder the Christian perspective on time. We learn that time is relentless. It waits for no one. We learn that it is pregnant with life and hope. Ultimately, it unveils a gracious and life-giving mystery in the victory of Christ. It is urgent, yet calling us to be patient in a trusting longing for the coming of the Lord. The final two verses of the Book of Revelation, and the final verses of the Bible, say, **"The one who gives this testimony says, 'Yes, I am coming soon'. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all". (Rev 22:20-21)** It is, indeed, calling us into a merciful and compassionate future of new life even in the face of death that is the passageway to new life.

# Advent Revival - December 6-7



We are pleased to welcome Father John Atoyebi for our Advent Revival. <u>It will take</u> place on December 6th and 7th at noon.

Fr. John Bola Atoyebi was born in Lagos, Nigeria. He attended grade school and high school in Nigeria.

He began his college

education in Nigeria and completed it in Rome in 1986. While studying in Rome, he met an American priest who encouraged him to become a priest in America. He was very reluctant at first but later accepted in 1987. He came to the United States on December 1, 1987, where he lived in Houston, Texas, for 18 months. He moved to Chicago in 1991 and resided at St. Philip Neri. He was ordained on May 21, 1994, becoming the first African in the Archdiocese. His first assignment was as an Associate Pastor at Benedict from 1994 – 1999.

In 1999, he was appointed Pastor of St. Clotilde, making him the first African to be appointed Pastor of a Church in Chicago. On February 6, 2006, he was appointed Pastor of Holy Angels Church.

Father John is now assisting at Ss. Peter and Lambert Parish in Skokie, Illinois.

Celebrating Black Catholic History Month: Authentically Black, Truly Catholic



Getting to Know Katie W. Jordan

It began with a welcoming, then an invitation, and before she knew it, Ms. Katie Jordan said "yes" to sharing her time, talents, and treasures with the Catholic Church in Chicago.

Ms. Katie W. Jordan was born in a small town in Arkansas in 1924. Growing up Methodist, she was instilled with the adage "if the pastor asks you for your help with something, you help if you can."

As an adult, her first encounter with the Catholic Church was sending her oldest child to kindergarten at a Catholic school in Arkansas. Like many before her, Ms. Katie with 3 children in tow, left Arkansas for a better life in Chicago.

When it was time to enroll her children in school, the public school refused them because not have children's she did her However, Catholic schools transcripts. embraced her children and allowed them to Her daughter attended Cathedral enroll. school and her sons attended Hales Franciscan and later joined the Air Force. By 1971, Ms. Katie still hadn't formally joined a Catholic Church but attended one faithfully located on 71st and

May.

All that changed when her neighbor invited her to come and visit St. Leo the Great. This was a transformative experience for her. She remembers fondly Fr. Turite standing at the door, taking her hand, and saying "Welcome, Welcome, we are so glad to have you." Her mother's advice of "always have a church home" rang true when she formally joined St. Leo the Great, attended RCIA classes, and formally became Catholic.

Fr. Turite, and later Fr. Furlan, encouraged Ms. Katie to become a representative from St. Leo for the newly formed Conference of the Laity created by the Archdiocese of Chicago. This pilot program trained and sent forth laity to parishes to help with evangelization efforts. As the only African American on the evangelization board, Ms. Katie actively recruited other African Americans from different parishes to join. She was named president of the board and helped spearhead events, workshops, and programs throughout some of Black Catholic parishes in Chicago the including, St. Sabina and St. Elizabeth.

Another invitation brought this dynamic woman of faith to Holy Angels. While serving as the music director at St. Leo, Tyrone Pittman would invite Ms. Katie to come to Holy Angels to worship. For a number of years, she would faithfully attend both parishes and when St. Leo closed in 2002, Holy Angels had already claimed her.

At 94 years young, Ms. Katie is still using her time, talents, and treasures to serve God and God's people. From prepping families for baby baptisms to now focusing her work on the bereavement ministry, Our Lady of Africa is truly blessed to count Ms. Katie W. Jordan as one of our own!

# **Breakfast with Santa**


