## **Reflections on the National Black Catholic Congress XIII - by Tina Carter**



From harnessing best practices for catechesis to taking the first step toward using social media for ministry, the National Black Catholic Congress had something for everyone. Over the course of 3 days, I had the opportunity to attend four sessions for new insights and ideas on how to serve God and God's people better.

The first session entitled **Black Catholic's Faith Online-A Prophetic Call to Evangelize Globally** presented by Michael Howard, course designer and professor for online courses at Loyola Marymount University, shared information about courses that one can take from home about Black Catholic Spirituality without the stress of getting an advanced degree.

The new course **Living the Gospels with Dr. King and Sr. Dr. Thea** explored how through the Word, spirituals, and storytelling, Dr. King and Sr. Dr. Thea were able to accompany, encourage, and actualize hope for liberation and social justice for the beloved community regardless of culture or faith tradition.

Developing Catechetical Resources from an Africentric Perspective presented by Therese Wilson Favors, former director of the Office of African American Ministries for the Archdiocese of Baltimore, provided tips, sources, and best practices for developing programs and other resources that honor and celebrate our Black Catholic Identity.

Live Streaming Your Mass and Technology was presented by Ronald Thomas, AV director and technical lead for St. Mary of the Purification Church in Houston TX talked at great length about developing an AV ministry at one's parish. A few things stood out in his presentation. 1. Livestreaming is an outreach ministry. For our sick and shut-ins as well as those who are out of state or overseas, livestreaming allows people to connect with the parish in a tangible way. 2. Parishes must be willing to make an investment in this ministry. The pandemic has forced us to use this new technology but this technology costs. To harness its full potential, we must be willing to invest.

Finally, In the session "Oh Lord Jesus It's a Fire': Reimaging Pastoral and Church Ministry in the Digital Age" Dr. Teddy Reeves, producer, and curator for the National Museum of African American History and Culture, reminded us that will have to be willing to meet with youth and communicate with them about Jesus and the faith without the labels that identify us belonging to a certain denomination, group, or tribe. Young people desire to have rich and fulfilling relationships with others, but they must be authentic and without judgment. We must be willing to learn from them and about their experiences with God. Our engagement should come from more than those chance interactions on Sunday. Just as our faith should be practiced with intention, so should the bonds that we develop with our youth and young Having a relationship with God and/or adults. each other that is on autopilot will not be fulfilling for God, others, or yourself. Like else, the everything we must make investment. This could mean, planning a movie outing, sponsoring a paint-and-sip event, or having a light discussion about God. By creating safe spaces and engaging activities, we can develop rich and fruitful encounters for our youth and ourselves thereby strengthening and building up the Kingdom of God.
