6th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Fr John Muir



Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. (Please don't tell anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, "If you will it, you can make me clean." At this, just before the healing, Jesus was "moved with compassion." The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and

love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it feels like to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will feel what we are feeling, and thereby heal us.

UNITY AND BLACK EXCELLENCE—OLA CHURCH MEMBER DR. KEITH WILSON

A convert to Catholicism, Keith Wilson, and his family were the 3rd African American family to move on 90th and Jeffery and attended the local public school in 1974. Unfortunately, due to bullying and harassment, Keith's parents pulled him out of public school and placed him at Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School on 89th and Exchange. While Keith was in third grade, everyone except his father converted.

For Dr. Keith Wilson, DDS his journey to becoming an Alpha Man began as a student at the University of Illinois at Chicago campus. As an undergraduate student, he learned about the rich heritage and commitment towards leadership. and community service to others. Keith also learned that he would be entering into a rich brotherhood shared with dignitaries who were Alpha men, such as Duke Ellington, Dick Gregory, and Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

In 1985, Keith began the process of crossing the sands and pledging Alpha. But by the time he was a senior in college living at home, his primary commitment became to finish school and graduate. That minor postponement however did not stop him from pledging Alpha Phi Alpha's lota Delta Lambda alumni Chapter of Chicago, one of the two alumni chapters in Chicago, on August 30, 1987.

As an active member of Alpha Phi Alpha, not only does Dr. Wilson's commitment extend financially to support scholarships and community partnerships, but there is also a strong brotherhood of men whose encouragement for each other extends beyond the chapters to which they may belong.

Founded in 1906 at Cornell University, what began as a literary and social club for African American students experiencing racism, morphed into the first African American Fraternity in the nation created by seven men seeking to promote collegiate excellence. Soon after, chapters were established at Howard and Virginia Union University. By 1945, Alpha Phi Alpha was open to men of all races and nationalities.

The motto of Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity incorporated is First of All, Servants of All, We Shall Transcend All." The mission of Alpha Phi Alpha is to develop leaders and promote brotherhood and academic excellence while providing service and advocacy for our communities.

Like other Greek organizations that comprise the Divine Nine, service and brotherhood extend well beyond the time that members experience in undergraduate, and yet, the lessons that they learn about accountability and service to humankind are lifelong.

Alpha Phi Alpha incorporates several Christian values such as love of neighbor, justice for all, and universal brotherhood in their spirituality. For Keith, it is through the melding of these values that a focus on service and community comes so naturally for him. In addition to the Men's Coalition and service as a lector at church, Keith also was involved with Project Alpha, a mentoring program for young men ages 13 to 18. He has also helped to spearhead a partnership with the Chicago Chapter of the March of Dimes for the annual Walk America Fundraiser for the Healthy Babies initiative.

Education, Service, and Brotherhood are all for the love of all humankind. These key pillars for Dr. Keith Wilson, DDS, and the men of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Incorporated are the legacy that they inherited in 1906 and work to pass on to future generations today.
