4th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gardis Watts

In the gospel reading for this week, we find Jesus starting his public ministry in a synagogue in Capernaum on the Sabbath day. Jesus is there not just teaching as a scribe but one with authority. As he was teaching, a man with an unclean spirit decides to interrupt him to ask him questions of what he wants of them and is he coming to destroy them. This man with the unclean spirit also identifies Jesus as from 'Nazareth' and the 'Holy One of God.' Jesus tells the man with the unclean spirit to be silent and drives the spirit out of the person. The onlookers were amazed at this feat and his popularity spread throughout the region of Galilee.

This scene in the gospel message is defined by many theologians and biblical scholars as Jesus first exorcism. While this is true, the much deeper context of this story is spiritual warfare. This warfare is not as simple as it seems to be. It is not a normal type of warfare where the combatants are identifiable. The purposes do not just lie in conquest but control. More importantly, the battlefield is not restricted to certain places. These battles can take place in the most unexpected places, even in a sacred space like church. Think about it, this spirit was able to hide itself in a synagogue amongst the people. If that evil spirit is bold enough to occupy the same sacred space as Jesus, what does that say about the security of our churches today?

In spiritual warfare, one of the more popular strategies is conquest of the mind. Possession by an unclean spirit does not necessarily look like how it goes down in Hollywood movies where the victim of the evil spirit levitates, twist their heads around and spits out green slime. People possessed by unclean spirits can look as normal as you and me. However, their thoughts are controlled by some malevolent force that not only causes confusion but also destruction. These thoughts can be manipulated through several mediums available. While all of this is rooted in a superficial purpose, the ultimate goal is to make people believe that it's the truth.

Jesus' teaching counteracts this false indoctrination. It is not just any regular teaching but teaching with 'authority.' The word 'authority' in the original language of this Gospel, which is Greek, is exousia, which means 'the power to act.' Jesus' teaching in this synagogue exemplifies a power so compelling that when the people heard this, they distinguished him from any ordinary rabbi. It was obvious that Jesus was liberating the listeners through his teachings.

We have to seriously consider that some of our churches are being influenced by forces that are not of God. Many of our places of worship have removed Jesus, which is how these forces infiltrated our sacred spaces. And while we may have the name of Jesus in our prayers, liturgy and imagery, some of us have lost our way and have been satisfied by the label of a follower instead of actually being a follower. If we are to remove these unclean spirits, we must engage in spiritual warfare by bringing Jesus back in our churches and allowing him to teach in an authoritative manner in our lives.
