## 5th Sunday of Lent - Clarissa V. Aljentera



Over the last summer my preschooler and I would be out and about all across Chicago. We noticed the skyscrapers and he would yell out, 'Wooo Chicago.' We would pass familiar parks and he would reminisce. And when we drove past police departments, he noticed the many migrant neighbors who were sitting on the sidewalk and gathered among their tents week after week.

I did not want to pass up an opportunity to engage him in the language of human dignity where we recognized someone as a neighbor and a friend. We led with curiosity and had honest conversations about the unhoused folks in Chicago. We addressed homelessness with gentleness. We talked about our migrant neighbors with love. His heart was longing for answers and my husband and I patiently answered as best we could.

We went into those places that we hear about in today's Gospel from John. Those grains of wheat can sometimes be people who are on the margins of society. We hear about the grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies. Those grains in some ways are those in our world we encounter daily - people struggling to find adequate housing, people who are victims of violence, and those who are living in places of great conflict such as Ukraine, Congo, and the Holy Land.

As Christians we believe that in those moments of encounter, we come face to face with Jesus. Today's Gospel tells us that when the grain of wheat dies, it can produce much

fruit. In our own lives there are opportunities to follow those grains of wheat to experience a new understanding. Think about the ways you have tried to avoid something uncomfortable. Or maybe it's happening when you have scrolled past something on social media. Maybe it was the person we passed on the way to the subway.

Children can sometimes push forth those grains of wheat in the questions they ask and through their view on the world. Instead of stepping around what could be fallen grains of wheat, imagine if like a child we observed and began to be curious to imagine another's experience.

There was a movement in my son's heart this Fall and he was convinced we needed to feed our migrant neighbors. We collected funds from family and friends and invited another family to come to the police station in West Englewood on a weekend morning to serve breakfast. Instead of ignoring or brushing past uncomfortable conversations, our hearts deeply listened not just as individuals but as a community to respond in loving ways. Where do you believe God is calling you to encounter those fallen grains of wheat? How does your heart want to respond?
