#### MEET MS IRENE DOVE AND GRANDDAUGHTER KIALI

For Irene Dove, she has been calling this church home, on and off for almost 75 years. Born in Mississippi, Ms. Dove and her family moved to Chicago in 1949. It was simply fate that the Baptist family moved across the street from Holy Angels school and church. The proximity of the school and her reasonable father is what led Ms. Dove and her siblings to eventually become Catholic.

Ms. Irene's grandmother was a strong influence on her life. Teaching her to pray and develop a strong relationship with God was the lesson that she received. Even today, she can be on her knees for hours praying to God, just as her grandmother taught her, and not even get tired.

The strong faith that Ms. Dove learned from her grandmother and developed at Holy Angels, she passed on to her son and now her 11-year-old granddaughter Kiali who is beginning to ask questions about the faith that has strengthened her for so long.

As a member of the **Blessed Sacrament Society** and an usher, Ms. Irene models the importance of volunteering to us and her granddaughter. You don't always have to be a leader in a ministry or group to lead. Just helping with various events and activities can be the most essential thing that a person does. These lessons are being passed on to Kiali who is a member of the soccer team and the group **Sister to Sister** at school.

For Kiali, **Sister to Sister**, a mentoring and peer program designed to motivate young women to become future leaders in their communities, is helping her to become a strong Black woman. Now, Kiali is turning to her grandmother for questions about faith, prayer, and how God fits into her life. Ms. Irene shares with Kiali the importance of prayer. She reminds Kiali to talk to God like you would talk to anyone else. God is with you everywhere. Any place you and God are together, you are in church. She also provides prayer books and most importantly, makes herself available to Kiali if she has any questions about God, the Catholic Christian faith, and prayer.

As Kiali learns more and more about being Catholic from her wonderful grandmother, let us pray that her faith journey is one filled with the love and joy that God and Christ have given us all.

## 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Reflection by Fr. Tracy O'Sullivan, OCarm

Today's Gospel puts the focus on the end of time for both the Church Year and, more importantly, it highlights fact that our world, personal and communal, will come to an end sooner than later. The gift of life expressed in our time, talent and treasure needs to cherished. It also needs to be developed and used responsibly as we face the relentless clock that moves us to the conclusion of our earthly journey. This trustworthy action is our way into the Mystery. There is nothing in life more important for us.

The simple and clear truth of the Gospel passages of the last two weeks is the daily challenge of our mortality. This means we have only the present moment to live! The past and the future are beyond our control. This is an overwhelming truth that we can grasp only in a minimal fashion. The saints are the ones who really get what it means to be mortal. Yet, each year the Church offers us a reminder at the end of the liturgical year that this life will come to an end. The more we are aware of it, the more we are able to direct our lives to our final destiny.

The message for us in today's Gospel is clear: to realize that God is calling us to use our time, talent and treasure in harmony with the coming kingdom of God. Our call is to create and support life in all of its various manifestations. This is seamless garment of life, from the womb to the tomb. We are invited to enter into and embrace the Gospel message of Jesus by always discovering new horizons of inclusion and acceptance and celebration. Our fundamental human task is to let reality open up the hidden presence of our loving God in all the wide-ranging expressions of humanity.

The image of God is a central driving force in the story of the three servants in today's parable. For the first two, even though they differ quite a bit in personal talents, God was seen as a generous and loving benefactor. They see God calling them to life in every way possible. The invitation to responsible living was rooted in God's merciful love.

For the third servant, fear was the consequence of an image of God as a harsh and demanding judge. This image relegated his world to a minimum of generosity and a maximum of evasion of any mistake. Love was just not a factor.

We have to move beyond the "dos and don'ts" of religion. The third servant operated out of a narrow and negligeable investment of time, talent and treasure. He sees a "go to mass on Sunday" as a nominal effort to satisfy a harsh and demanding judge who holds out the threat of eternal punishment. He puts God on the fringe of life, a necessary but onerous obligation.

We need an image of God where love and mercy liberate and enrich us. We are empowered to advance in confidence with the gifts of our time, talent and treasure. God is calling us to share in the creation of his kingdom by walking with Jesus.
