

Message from our Pastor...

Dear Parishioners, Friends and Guests:

We give a very warm welcome to +Fr. George Clements Family and Friends and Guests today. I am also grateful to Fr. Tracy O'Sullivan, O.Carm. for being here to Preside and Preach. He knew +Fr. George very well from their work on the south side.

Today, we celebrate +Fr. George Clements Birthday, the former longtime serving Pastor of Holy Angels Church, now Our Lady of Africa Parish, in our Bronzeville Neighborhood. He was one of the Prophets among us on the south side of Chicago, but he was also a Prophet to the United States and the World. He was even a Prophet to the Continent of Africa and the Caribbean Islands.

+Fr. George Clements respectfully challenged the Roman Catholic Hierarchy right up to the Vatican and the Political Leadership in Chicago, the United States and beyond. He also challenged his fellow Priests and Religious in Chicago and our Country as well to do what is right and just. And he challenged all members of all races, including his own, to "authentic Gospel living" all the time. He was and always will be remembered as a Prophet who lived and served among us.

Some accomplishments of Fr. Clements are listed here but I would need Volumes to write about all of them. Bringing Social Justice and Racial Equality to the South Side of Chicago and this City and Nation in all its healthy forms. He had along with +Fr. Paul Smith one of the finest and the largest Catholic Schools in the United States at Holy Angels for years too numerous to count. He Adopted African American Children when no one else would consider it until he did it and brought it to their attention prophetically. Fr. Clements also promoted the Black Culture and History in all its wonderful Forms. He was a devoted Shepherd and Pastor to his Parishioners, going to Africa to serve God's people and the Caribbean as well, and, working hard to stop Drug Abuse and Violence in our Nation from Chicago to Washington, DC and beyond.

The list goes on and on as I said above. And, for a very long time, he was still helping fellow Priests/Religious/Parishioners out by serving at weekend Masses on the South Side of Chicago, always making a difference. He walked the "Way of the Cross" during the last year of his life. One day when I phoned him, his last comment to me was "I am walking the Via de La Crucis and I don't mind walking with Jesus." We know he was constantly being put to the test, mostly by the evil that existed around him. God always supported him in these challenges, as God always supports us in our challenges.

Remember, +Fr. George was a Prophet among us who endured suffering and he is a Prophet who continues to intercede and work on our behalf from his Heavenly home. Finally, may all the prophetic men and women in our lives sent by God, past, present, and future, give you hope and inspire you and nudge you and I when we really need it.

Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time - C Lk 4:21-30

Dear Friends,

Today's gospel passage offers a dramatic turn of events. It is a look back and a plunge into the future. It is hard to grasp the incredibly rapid transformation from "All spoke highly of him." (Lk 4:22) to they "led him to the brow of the hill…to hurl him down headlong." (Lk 4:29)

Their rejection was clear and emphatic. It had been foretold by Simeon in the Temple. "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted." (Lk 2:34-35)

Looking to the future, the scene of furious and singular rejection will be repeated on a larger scale as Jesus arrives in Jerusalem. At the heart of both the earlier and later rejections, and the continuing rejection in our day, is Jesus' message of universal love. Jesus presents a God who offers hospitality to all. This image of God calls for change. A deep conversion must shatter the limited and comfortable religious vision expressed in the statement, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" (Lk 4:22) Isn't he one of us? Doesn't he share our sense of privilege and prestige and exclusion as God's special people? The townsfolk quietly understood, just like the chief priests and scribes later on, that Jesus was a threat to their comfort and control. They would have gladly made Jesus a local hero if they could set the agenda. They were the first in a long history of Christianity to try to make Jesus over in their image. Their Jesus would fit right in with their prejudices and ignorance, their lack of concern for the "other" in all its many manifestations that still are expressed in today's headlines.

I recently heard a joke on this issue. They got rid of all the foreigners, immigrants, and poor at the Nativity scene so only the donkeys and cows were left.

Jesus understood clearly. He faced a choice about the integrity of his message and the reality of the God of universal acceptance and hospitality. The "Nazareth game" is played out in our churches, parishes, communities and Church even today. We are ever into the Jesus makeover. We definitely are looking for the more comfortable model.

"Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away." (Lk a4:30) He did the same with the hostile leaders who thought they were getting rid of him in the crucifixion. That time Jesus passed through their midst in the resurrection and ascension. He does the same to us. Yet he never forsakes us. He is always calling us, like Peter, to a place we would rather not go.

Walking with Jesus involves a relentless shattering of our horizons. It makes a steady and consistent expansion of our reluctance to accept the "other." Jesus' message never lets us rest in the comfortable home of our prejudices and blindness. Jesus is always asking us to share the hospitality of the Father for all.

n June 26, 2020, Fr. Ricardo Antonio Cortez Martínez, rector of the St. Óscar Arnulfo Romero seminary in Usulutan, El Salvador, sent a request to the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America for financial aid for 42 seminarians in the philosophy stage of their formation. Less than two months later, on August 7, Fr. Ricardo was found assassinated. Despite a falling homicide rate in El Salvador, three priests were slain from 2019 through August 2020.

To answer the call to priestly or consecrated life is a courageous act of faith, especially in a time and place where priests face violence, as Fr. Ricardo did. The Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America recognizes the courage and openness of seminarians, such as those at the St. Óscar Arnulfo Romero seminary, by supporting their formation as they prepare for lives of dedicated service. Your support for the Collection for the Church in Latin America makes it possible for young men in El Salvador and throughout Latin America and the Caribbean to answer that call.
